THE ACADEMY DAY

Our school day starts at 8.45 am sharp, this is when the school gates will be shut, and all students should be in the tutor room ready for the ready-to-learn time (RTL) . Arriving after this time will incur a 'late' sanction. If you wish to be on the school site earlier than this, you are welcome to arrive at our dining hall from 8.00am where a selection of cereals and baked goods will be available to purchase. Students in receipt of free school meals will have an additional £1 accredited to their accounts to be used during the breakfast club.

You will attend five lessons per day in a range of subjects and will be given your timetable with classrooms and teachers on your first week with us. You will also be given a Form Group and Tutor and you will take part in daily Dedicated Reading Time (DRT) with year group specific text.

Take a look at our sample timetable to get a feel for what your days will be like at our academy. From Dedicated Reading Time sessions to our after-school activity slot, TSA days will be packed with motivational learning. All students are expected to be on time for school and for lessons. Each day, all students must be in the tutor room be ready to learn with all the equipment they need by 8.45am. Our aim is to get you into excellent habits for your time in school and the workplace

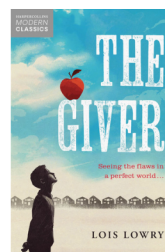
DEDICATED READING TIME

At The Skipton Academy, we are passionate about ensuring all our students become competent, confident and fluent readers who can fully access our broad and challenging curriculum.

As a result, we have developed a robust literacy and reading strategy to ensure that all our students can experience a rich and diverse reading curriculum, whilst developing the requisite vocabulary, reading, writing and oracy skills to succeed in all subjects.

Vocabulary is explicitly and systematically taught both in lessons and during Dedicated Reading Time to enable students to understand the relationships between words and nuances of meaning. A wide vocabulary will empower students to articulate their thoughts, emotions and ideas effectively as well as enabling them to engage more deeply with the written and spoken word. Through reading in particular, students have a chance to develop culturally, emotionally, intellectually and socially. Children who can read are overwhelmingly more likely to succeed at school, achieve good qualifications, and subsequently enjoy a fulfilling and rewarding career.

Central to our literacy and reading strategy is our Dedicated Reading Time which takes place four times a week after registration and Ready to Learn time. Students follow a well-sequenced reading curriculum, enjoying a wide range of texts which will be read aloud by their form tutors. Reading aloud to children has a profound effect on their reading ability allowing them to hear the expression and intonation that is essential for language learning and vocabulary acquisition. Motivation to read is closely related to reading ability. Consequently, we model effective reading so that all students can participate irrespective of their starting points. We make reading something that all students can access both physically at the same time and place each day and emotionally where they are able to feel like a valued members of The Skipton Academy reading community.

DINING

The Skipton Academy provides students with a wide range of catering and meal options. All meals are freshly prepared on-site using locally sourced ingredients. The menu changes regularly to ensure that students have access to a variety of healthy food options. Students are able to choose from a range of meal options including hot meals, sandwiches, salads, and more. There is also a breakfast menu available each morning.

At all times TSA students are expected to behave in a calm and respectful manner in the dining hall and queue sensibly to purchase food. At TSA you will use your ID card to purchase your food electronically from our tills, this will automatically deduct money from your account. Parents/carers will be emailed full information about how to set up and top up your account including full details about eligibility for free school meals. You are welcome to bring a healthy packed lunch should you prefer and we recommend that you bring a refillable water bottle (water only) to keep you hydrated throughout the day.

Please note that the academy does not allow and will confiscate/sanction the following items in accordance with its promotion of healthy eating:

- Energy or fizzy drinks
- Chewing/bubble gum
- Family or multi-packs of sweets, biscuits, and crisps.

EXPECTATIONS

At TSA our high expectations extend to every inch of our academy, including how you conduct yourself when travelling to and from school. We want our students to be polite, calm, and courteous and to always be positive role models for the academy. You will be expected to walk calmly around the building and to behave respectfully at social times, looking after the school environment and wearing your uniform with pride.

Any student failing to follow TSA expectations, the first time, every time, will be subject to school sanctions. TSA's Positive Behaviour policy is applied consistently by all staff to ensure that no moment of learning time is lost and that every student feels safe. Our complete system of sanctions and rewards will be explained in detail to you during the TSA Be Awesome Day and you will find a summary of this in all classrooms around the school. Your Form Tutor will support you with guidance and reminders during the first few weeks and beyond to help you develop your positive learning habits.

BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

CLASSROOM REWARDS

CLASSROOM REWARDS

At TSA we love nothing better than rewarding excellent effort, exemplary behaviour and participation. We do this regularly in lessons, corridors, assemblies and social times, we are always on the lookout!

Our rewards are called Positive Behaviour Points which will be awarded throughout the school day and logged on the computer system. The more points that you achieve, the more awards and prizes you will win; these will be handed out at the end of every term. You can win Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum certificates and phone calls home and even be invited to reward trips or receive fantastic prizes. Every week you stand a chance to win, 'TSA Star of the Week' and other esteemed titles.



At The Skipton Academy, we understand the importance of rewarding our students for their hard work and dedication. We believe that providing recognition for accomplishments is key to developing a positive school culture and motivating students to strive for excellence. Rewarding our students sends a message that their efforts are appreciated and valued. We are committed to developing a culture of excellence where students can be proud of their achievements and strive to reach their highest potential.

CLASSROOM CONSEQUENCES

Our behaviour system is really clear and is designed to ensure that you are supported in adopting positive learning habits from the very moment that you join us. At TSA we are passionate about your education and we will not accept any interruptions to learning. If you follow our behaviour system in and around the academy then you never receive a sanction. TSA students should be on time, on task and act out our core values at all times.

Behaviour negative

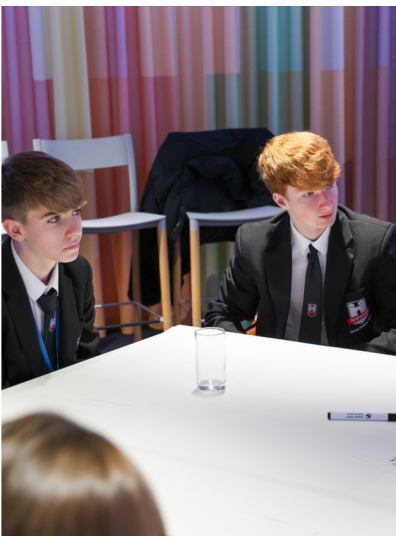
Your behaviour hasn't improved and a negative will be logged

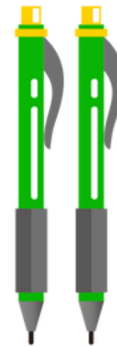

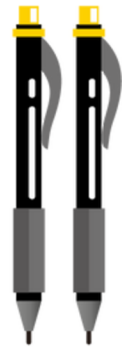

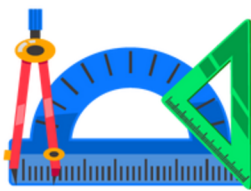

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Our uniform is sensible, practical and smart and we expect that students will wear it with pride. Students can expect to be challenged where they fall short of our high expectations. Students are ambassadors for the school when they are out in the community and wearing school uniform and are expected to behave accordingly.

Blazer, Shirt, Tie, Hair Cut & Colour

Black blazer with the school crest. White shirt that must be worn buttoned at the neck and tucked in; short fitted styles are not acceptable uniform. School tie with the crest and red stripe. Hair colour and style must be appropriate to school. Extreme cuts and styles including 'tram lines' or colours are not acceptable. Plain, V-necked in black pullover is optional but must contain the academy logo. Headscarf if worn needs to be black.

Trousers, Skirts, Jewellery & Make-up

Black, tailored trousers. Hipsters, flares or overlong trousers are not acceptable. Students must not wear jeans, chinos, joggers or slim/skinny fit etc. Black pleated skirt must be worn with plain black opaque tights and not leggings. Pencil and tube skirts are not permissible. Jewellery and make-up should not be worn. Students are permitted to wear one stud earring in each ear lobe.

Footwear & Coat

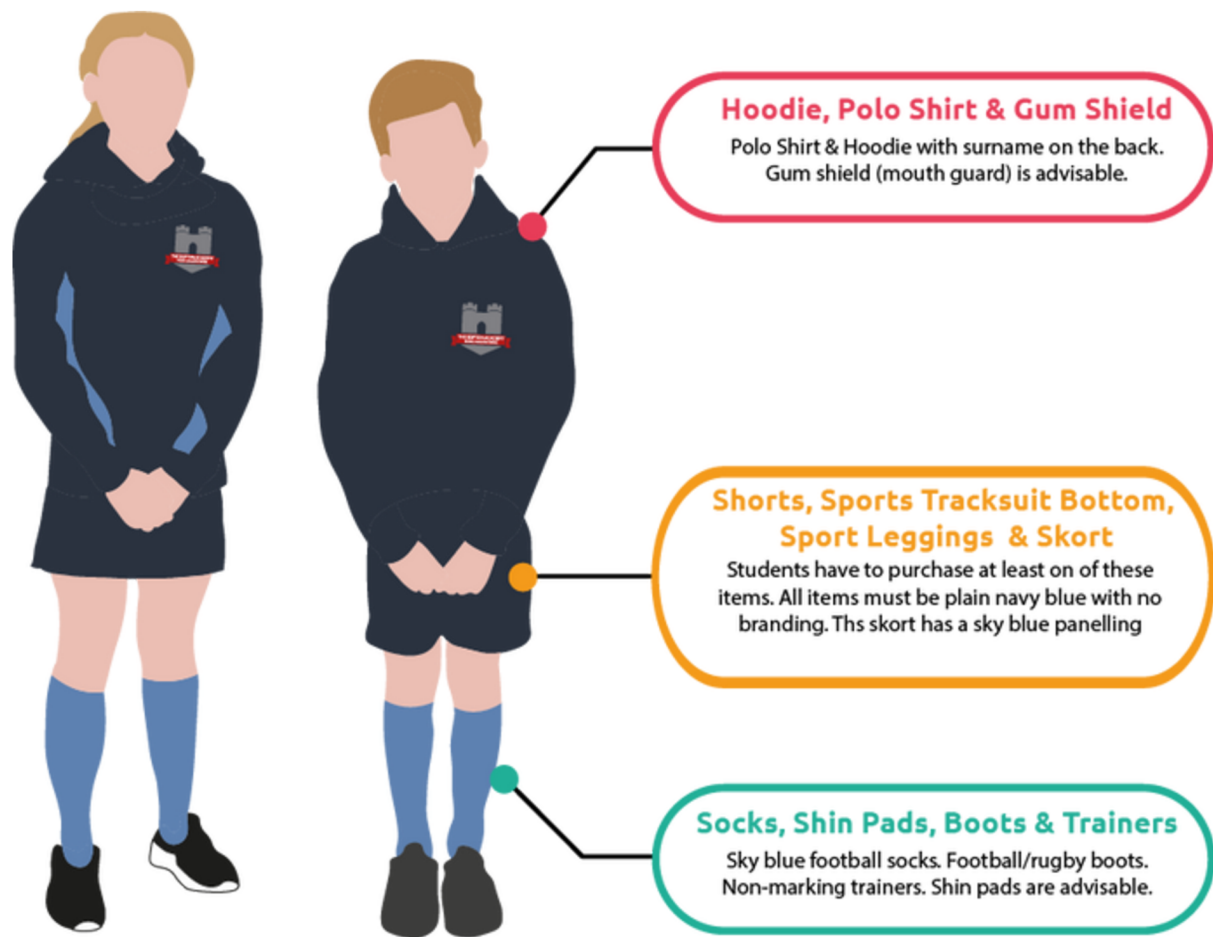
Sensible black shoes or plain black trainers. Footwear mustn't have any additional colouring and any logos must be black. Shoes must be either flat or with low heels. Students are permitted to wear a coat outside at break and lunchtimes over the top of the blazer.



We cannot wait to see you in September looking smart in your new uniform. The correct uniform should be worn at all times within, and on the way to and from, the academy. If you arrive in incorrect uniform, you will be given a sanction and will be expected to borrow an item of clothing so that your learning is not disrupted.

PE UNIFORM

At TSA we have excellent sports areas. We want our pupils to be dressed appropriately and feel ready to get active. It's important to us that students wear the correct P.E. uniform at all times. You will be able to purchase all our uniform from Skip to School, 32-34 Water St, Skipton BD23 1PB.



Doing physical exercise helps to boost physical health, mental well-being and overall performance. It can help to improve concentration, reduce stress and fatigue, and increase energy levels. Additionally, it can help to build team spirit, foster cooperation, and create a sense of camaraderie. Therefore, it is essential that students make time to incorporate physical exercise into their daily activities.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Lost Property

Please ensure that your uniform/equipment is named; secondary school is a much larger setting and things can go missing very easily if not. All lost property should be handed in at reception. If a student loses any item they should ask at the reception if it has been found. Named items are returned to students via Form Tutors. Items that are not named are placed in lost property. These are held until the end of term.

Phones and Technology

You are allowed to bring them to school but it must be switched off and out of sight at all times. Your phone should not be heard or seen during lesson time and lesson changeover. You can use your phone at social times such as breaktime and lunchtime. If your parents/carers need to contact you, they will phone the main reception and ask for a message to be passed on to you.

Transport

We encourage all students, where possible, to walk or cycle to school. For those students living outside of Skipton, we ask parents and students they allocate enough time, to ensure they arrive to school on time
